Computer - \$ 701.72 - New Dell Computer for the Lunch Program Coordinator. The previous computer from Dell used for the lunch program was purchased in January 2010.

Fees past due: Number of students with past due fees decreased from 22 to 18. Attendance sheets for the month of November and December were reviewed and it was determined that some students were classified as`` not in the program`` and going home for lunch. Due to the colder weather students are now staying at school. Phone calls will be made to parents to pay into the program at a prorated rate.

Parents of seven students will be called to submit the semi-annual payment owing for Feb. 1st in the amount of \$110.00. Lunch fees will remain the same for the September 2017 school year. To date 473 students have paid to stay at school during lunch.

Staff Complement: No change. Supervisors remain at 21.

Win a Pizza Lunch: Students in Grade 7 Ms Matthews and students in Grade 6 Mr Wright were the winners for the month of November. For the month of December the 2 classroom winners were Grade 5 Ms McKie and Grade 7 Ms Fogg.

Meetings: The lunch supervisor meeting held on January 18 was well attended by 19 supervisors. Agenda included a review of guidelines for the students in grades 5 to 8 to participate in the`` win a pizza lunch``. The grade 9 students will not be included. The grade 9 students have asked and prefer to eat lunch with their friends in other grade 9 classrooms. The number of students in each grade 9 class will be monitored to ensure we have sufficient supervision. Other items discussed on the agenda included increased enrollment, more classrooms, past due fees, allergies and classroom clean up.

Library: As of December 12th a lunch supervisor has been assigned to assist Joy Nadeau in the library. Students` registering to stay in the library has increased from 30 to 60.
